MOAB MUSIC FESTIVAL RECEIVES SHOP IN UTAH GRANT

Grant Enables Festival to Offer Half Price Hike Tickets



The Moab Music Festival is very pleased to announce today that it has received funding from a "Shop in Utah" grant, part of the COVID-19 Impacted Businesses Grant Program for small companies and organizations in the state. As the Festival moves ahead with a streamlined, all-outdoor series of performances beginning on August 31, which responsibly follows all state and public health guidelines, this important support will enable it to offer tickets to its coveted Music Hikes at half-price, so even more people can enjoy *music*



in concert with the landscape®.

The "Shop in Utah" grant matches each discounted ticket sold with an equal amount to assist with the costs associated with the Festival, as well as a supplementary equal amount to assist with the costs associated with the Festival. "Beyond being widely-regarded as one of America's most imaginative music series," said Executive Director Laura Brown, "the Moab Music Festival has been an important part of the Grand County community for almost 30 years. It has contributed significantly to the economic health of the region, and we are so grateful to have this meaningful recognition and tangible support from the state."

The Music Hikes have become a Festival favorite – each of four invigorating Hikes takes explorers out to the wilderness to discover Moab's natural wonders, as they meet bright and early and are transported to stunning, surprise locations for a moderately rigorous hike to an hour-long concert. The Hikes are on Saturday's September 5 and 12, and Sunday's September 6 and 13. Highlights this season include the local premiere of a brand new work by Pulitzer Prize-winner John Luther Adams by the much buzzed about JACK Quartet in *Everything That Rises*, and the closing concert of the Festival, *String Theory*, of music from Bach and Prokofiev to Jakub Ciupinski and Daron Hagen.

"Shop in Utah" is a \$25-million initiative that provides grants to businesses negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. At the Legislature's request, the program is administered by the Governor's Office of Economic Development.
